2. Declarations of Interest

3. Minutes

Councillor Tomkinson asked if everyone was agreeable that the minutes of the meeting held on Monday 3rd July could be signed as a correct record of the minutes and everyone agreed.

D Yarcombe Community Land Trust

Councillor Horner advised Councillor Tomkinson no further progress had been made.

E Jubilee Hall Committee

Councillor Tomkinson reported the builders had started work again on 4th September taking down walls which had been built incorrectly. The work will take 8 weeks.

F Reports from Individual Councillors

Councillor Ford advised that there was a signpost missing at Underdown Farm. Also, footpath 19 is very overgrown. She will liaise with Ros Davies and find out the procedure regarding trimming of footpaths.

Councillor Myhill had nothing to report.

Councillor Billington reported about speeding in the village.

Community Speed Watch: He still needs 1 more person to complete the training. Once this has been done the speed watch can take place. When this is done the police community speed officer will also join them on some occasions and will issue speeding fines.

He is also investigating funding for Vehicle Activated Speed Limit sign.

CIL - Community Infrastructure Levy

The parish council must use the CIL receipts passed to it to support the development of the parish council's area by funding the provision, improvement, replacement, operation, or maintenance of infrastructure; or anything else that is concerned with addressing the demands that development places on the area.

Clerk to send email to Cllrs Brown & Levine clarifying the usage and time limits and requesting any advice they have.

Councillor Thomson queried about the grass around the planters. She had strimmed around the planters again. She thought the village was looking rather untidy especially from the planter in the layby up to Tillery. The clerk will contact Phil Holness regarding this being completed but no need to remove the cuttings. The clerk will also send an email to Cllrs Brown & Levine to find out the cutting programme in our parish.

Councillor Vining had advised Councillor Tomkinson that he had repaired a stile on footpath 29 and also removed a tree on footpath 30.

Councillor Long reported the building materials on public land by Calways had been removed.

5. Highway Meeting Report From Councillor Tomkinson

DCC Meeting Notes with Yarcombe Parish Council

Potholes

Tom Vaughan showed document about state of lanes and roads with money spent, will leave it with us.

Response time of 2 hours, next day, 7 days or 28 days.

Cllr Horner mentioned about the hole not being repaired but tarmac was wasted in a field entrance. Tom said that the process isn't necessarily efficient as they have to be aware of legal responsibilities. Triage system didn't kick in.

Cllr Billington asked about differing levels of access to the pothole computer scheme to see what has been triaged and likely date of repair.

David asked about priority of lanes as they have repaired a lane that isn't important and not done others that are.

Cllr Billington raised that roads have been attributed to us whereas they aren't ours and Dave Ashford has said we have had our budget. Tom and Robert said budgets aren't allocated like that.

Crawley Bridge

Talked about helping people be aware about the narrowness of the bridge not being aware, Robert said that landowners are responsible for keeping foliage down. Either Slow or road narrowing painting might be used.

Rag Lane Gabions

Still working to re-open the road and are in negotiations with the landowner, but unable to divulge details of discussions. Two contractors have been asked to provide quotes for the works.

Highways Warden Scheme

Stuart has been a road warden for about 6 years. Cllr Billington pointed out that we have an aging population with less ability to do the work than perhaps most.

Chapter 8 training takes two day and has to be paid for up front and then reclaimed. About £300 per person. Do an online road safety course beforehand.

A30 Fatality

Cllr Long mentioned that part of the safety chevrons are missing.

6. Police Attendance at meetings and required reports

Clerk to send email to Darren England PCSO requesting a representative to attend meetings. The parish council would like details of the following:

Winnowing Knapp structure in garden Clerk to chase with East Devon.

Marsh Farm no permission for mobile home. Look to enforcement to visit again – has been twice before.

Black Aller Farm – recently sited mobile home – will speak to occupier with regards to this.

Waterhayne Farm – Checking to see what we can do to progress to encourage planting again.

Broadley Farm - still unsatisfactory planting screening?

Blackdown Hills ANOB – Yarcombe Parish Council are frustrated and disappointed with the AONB that their comments are a little unforthcoming. We are hoping to look into what we can do to encourage more interaction. Cllr Thompson is going to enquire if the Blackdown Partnership we are in can help.

10. Open Session for Public Participation

A member of the public queried about the maintenance of James Lane. He was advised who to contact at DCC. He also advised he may contact Spotlight TV.

The parish information leaflet needs updating. Cllr Billington is working on this and a draft will be circulated for any amendments.
